
# **Approaches to Enterprise Linux**

This survey asks respondents to report:


What IT initiatives are you using or will you use Linux for?

- What do you need from your Linux vendor that you're not receiving?




### What version of Linux are you running?



Those surveyed report Ubuntu is the most widely used Linux version, run by 37%.




### What IT initiatives are you using or will you use Linux for?



Linux is being primarily used in database initiatives by nearly half of respondents. This contrasts with only 12% applying it in IoT/edge deployments.



### **How do you currently support Linux?**




Usually, organizations support Linux with on-staff experts (55%) or paid/free support associated with the OS. Relatively rare is outsourced or managed support (16%).




### How satisfied are you with your current version of Linux? (Rate 1 to 5: 1= not at all satisfied, 5 = highly satisfied)






### What are your biggest challenges with your current Linux environment?



The most common Linux challenge respondents cite is not a problem with the environment per se, but with acquiring or training skilled staff, say 43%.




## Does your Linux distribution come with a dedicated product security team that monitors, identifies, and addresses risks to your data?





### What do you need from your Linux vendor that you're not receiving?



37% of survey respondents are demanding 24/7 engineer support. 24% want lifecycle managment and/or software interoperability.



### Do you have plans to make a change in the version of Linux you're currently using?



Though only 16% of those surveyed are actively planning to change their version of Linux in the next year, most would consider switching - if value was demonstrated.
